Placements that are out of county may also incur a charge as these may have to be checked by Careers Wales. We have recently been informed that due to recent contract changes between Prospects and Careers Wales, any placement in Gloucestershire with an NP16 postcode is considered to be 'out of county', regardless of its geographical location and therefore under the remit of Careers Wales. Thus these placements could also incur a charge if a check is required.

Curriculum Parents' Evening **Wednesday, 21st April 2010**

6.00pm – 8.00pm *[Depending on number of workshops attended.]*

Venue: G15 to start at 6.00pm

Format:

- ❖ An introductory talk by Clive Pemberton and Karyn Taylor re the curriculum and Wyedean's approach to homework and independent learning
- ❖ This will be followed by a carousel of 30 minute workshops, please see choices below. [Parents can sign up for a choice of 1, 2 or 3 workshops]

Please note that workshop choices will be allocated in the order in which responses are received. You will notice from the description of the workshops that some of these are similar/ overlap in content. Please select the workshops most relevant to you and your child/children's needs.

Boosting your child's literacy at home

The session will involve a presentation on aspects of grammar which students often get wrong. These will include:

- ❖ Different types of sentences
- ❖ Paragraph Organisation
- ❖ Paragraph Cohesion (linking devices, so a paragraph 'knits' together)

We will also spend some time looking at ways to improve students' writing through using different writing (stylistic) devices and end with some practical advice about how to improve your child's writing skills at home.

Economic Wellbeing: Preparing students for their future

The 'Economic Wellbeing' programme aims to provide students with the knowledge, understanding and skills they will need to make an affective transition into the world of work. This workshop, which is particularly suited to parents of students in Years 9-11, will focus on the different strands of the Economic Wellbeing programme (Work Related Learning, Enterprise Education, Careers Education and Financial Capability), how they are delivered in school and how you can support your child with their careers decisions.

Effective Revision: How to Motivate Your Child during the Revision Period.

The workshop aims to demonstrate some effective revision skills that parents can encourage students to use. The techniques highlighted will focus on the use of "questions" to aide memory. The techniques will be interactive so that parents can work with and support students at revision time. As all parents know the hard part is creating and maintaining the motivation to revise. The session will explore some strategies that can make revision a fun and worthwhile experience. The workshop is open to all parents, but will be particularly relevant to parents of Key Stages 4 and 5.

How can we help our children to learn?

At Wyedean School, students in Year 7 and 10 have one lesson a fortnight in which they are coached on how to learn. At this workshop we will give a brief insight into the type of activity that the students experience, for example looking at team work and thinking skills. Come along and join us for what should be fun.

Key Stage 4 Mathematics

This workshop will be of most interest to parents with children in years 9, 10 and 11. Content will specifically include:

- ❖ The structure of the modular mathematics course and an assessment schedule for each year group, 9 to 11
- ❖ Details of exam content, duration and timing, and resit opportunities
- ❖ Foundation and Higher Tier grade content and grade ranges for each tier
- ❖ Percentage weighting of each module
- ❖ Revision support for students (classes and other resources)
- ❖ Question and answer session

What is Assessment for Learning?

Assessment for Learning is a national initiative which has changed the way teachers teach and students learn. Assessment for Learning teaching strategies are used in every Key Stage in Wydean School. In this workshop we will look at what it is and why we do it. We will also look at how Assessment for Learning looks in the classroom and what pupils will experience because of it.

Year 10: GCSE Coursework and controlled assessments + motivating your teenager

An overview of:

- ❖ What's happening when for Year 10 GCSE coursework, exams and controlled assessments
- ❖ What's different about this year, the advantages of the new system, and how parents can support their children
